




## **Evaluation Report**

The <u>Evaluation of the Seminar</u> in Nicosia (Cyprus) was done on the basis of the **30 presented evaluation forms**, which is one third of all the participants taking part at the Seminar. Submitted reports represent mostly the views of **Higher Education Institutions**, having half of the forms submitted by Universities and University Colleges. Other submitted forms were by representatives of Non-Governmental Organisations and Governmental Agencies/Institutions.

The <u>content of the Seminar</u> is viewed very positively reaching **95% of good/excellent** evaluations. This includes in order or preference **key contributors, workshops and the panel discussion**. **Speakers** at the Seminar have been **very well evaluated**, with the presentation of Ms de Groote being especially appreciated.



General experience during the Seminar gave very good overall results. Besides the side activities and the social programme, catering and the premises, participants have found the Seminar very well organised, providing a valuable programme and a platform for networking. The information provided prior to the Seminar has been greeted.

An excellent feedback was given as well for the <u>social</u> <u>programme</u>, giving a valuable **cultural aspect** to the Seminar as well.

For <u>further improvements</u>, it has been suggested to prepare **smaller groups** for workshops and foster communication between participants, same as **more time for questions and answers**.

Most of the participants <u>learnt about the Seminar</u> through **EURASHE's website or Newsletters**. A large number of participants have stated that they were informed about the Seminar through other colleagues, showing a good reputation of EURASHE in the field of Higher Education.

The overall satisfaction with the Seminar was evaluated with 19 excellent and 11 good grades.
