


Evaluation Report

The evaluation of EURASHE's Seminar in Bucharest (Romania) was done on the basis of the **14 presented evaluation forms**, which is one fifth of all the attendants participating in the seminar. Submitted reports represent mostly the views of **higher education institutions**, having more than half of the forms submitted by higher education university colleges/universities of applied sciences and governmental agencies/institutions. Other submitted forms were by representatives of universities and NGOs.

The content of the seminar is viewed very positively reaching **90% of good/excellent** evaluations. The plenary sessions and working groups were evaluated well. **Speakers** in the plenary sessions have been **well evaluated**, with the presentations of Mr Bollaert and Mr Aerden being especially appreciated.



General experience during the workshop gave **very good overall results**. The most acknowledged were the information provided prior to the seminar, as well as the overall organisation and the logistics. Participants have as well appreciated the social programme.

For further improvements, it has been suggested to ensure space/sessions for presentation of participants, expanding this way networking opportunities, and to give more information on non-European QA practices. Most of the participants learnt about the workshop through **other colleagues** or **newsletters**. A large number of participants have stated that they were informed about the seminar through EURASHE website or other EURASHE communication, showing a good reputation of EURASHE in the field of higher education.

The overall satisfaction with the workshop was evaluated with 8 excellent and 5 good grades.
